#### **Student Arrest Rates:**

In 2019, Pittsburgh Public Schools arrested students at 8x the rate of Philadelphia Public Schools (a district 5.8 times the size of Pittsburgh).

### Demographic of Pittsburgh Public School Arrests:

37% of students arrested were Black girls

44% of students arrested were Black boys

35% of students arrested had a disability (IDEA)

The most common charge listed for arrest was Disorderly Conduct 87% of ALL

Disorderly Conduct charges were issued to Black youth

Disorderly conduct can be charged for typical youth behavior, such as excessive noise, obscene language or gestures




## CITATIONS AND ARRESTS OF PITTSBURGH YOUTH (2019)

Pittsburgh School

Black boys are cited at 6x
the rate of white boys

Black girls are cited at 11x
the rate of white girls



Summary citations (non-traffic tickets) are adult criminal offenses, although they are issued for minor behaviors, like vaping or disorderly conduct. Convictions can have serious, long-term consequences for youth. Typically, youth are charged fines by a magistrate, in addition to other requirements. When young people fail to meet these terms (Failure to Comply), they are sent to juvenile court. Summary convictions create a criminal record for young people.

## Failure to Comply:

1/3 of all referrals to juvenile justice in Allegheny County are for Failure to Comply.

Black youth are **10 times** more likely than White youth to be referred to juvenile justice for failure to pay a fine

**Recommendation:** City and School police should <u>place a moratorium on issuing summary citations to youth</u> until issues around disproportionality can be addressed, and clear guidelines can be established around if/when to issue them.
